Call 911 for the fastest Police response for all incidents/issues/assistance. Officers, when on patrol are not in the station to answer phone calls. Not just for emergencies.

BE MINDFUL AND AWARE: There are fewer hours of daylight in the fall season. It is common for children to play outside or ride their bicycles in the earlier darkness. People are walking their dogs, jogging or taking late afternoon or evening walks. In the fading light of dusk, it is more difficult to see the children and pedestrians.



School bus transportation is safe.

In fact, buses are safer than cars! Even so, last year, approximately 26 students were killed and another 9,000 were injured in incidents involving school buses.

More often than not, these deaths and injuries didn't occur in a crash, but as the pupils were entering and exiting the bus.





SCHOOL BUS



Stay away from the bus until it comes to a complete stop and the driver signals you to enter.

Stay away from the bus until the driver gives his/her signal that it's ok to approach.



Keep a safe distance between you and the bus. Also, remember that the bus driver can see you best when you are back away from the bus.

Have a safe place to wait for your bus, away from traffic and the street.

Be aware of the street traffic around you.

Drivers are required to follow certain rules of the road concerning school buses, however, not all do.

When being dropped off, exit the bus and walk ten giant steps away from the bus.

Use the handrail to enter and exit the bus.

Protect yourself and watch out!

Recreational Fire Pits are permitted as long as consideration for your neighbors is practiced. Always be sure fire is completely extinguished




