STAY INFORMED

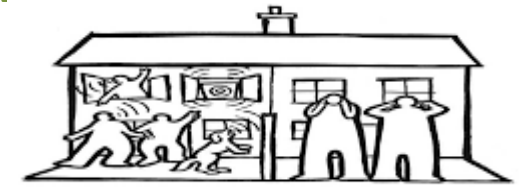
- Check local news for extreme heat alerts and safety tips

ALL TRASH MUST BE IN CANS WITH LIDS

- [Amended 5-10-1984 by Ord. No. 543; 12-13-2001 by Ord. No. 634]
- A.** All garbage, before being placed in garbage cans for collection, shall have drained from it all free liquids and may be wrapped in paper.
 - B.** All rubbish shall be drained of liquid before being deposited for collection.
 - (1)** Garbage receptacles shall be made of metal or plastic, must be watertight and be provided with a tight-fitting cover.
 - (2)** No person shall use for the receipt of garbage any receptacle weighing more than 40 pounds when filled.
 - (3)** All garbage receptacles are to be kept as sanitary as possible in view of the use to which they are put and shall be thoroughly cleansed by the owner or user after garbage is removed by the collector.

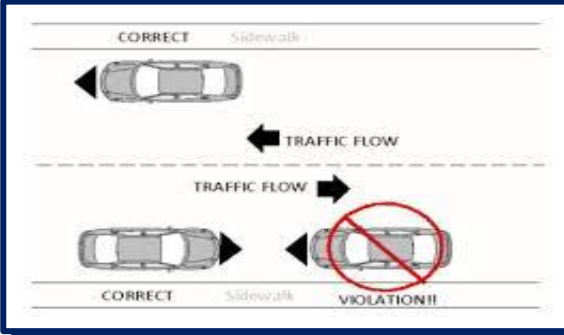
Mayor's Corner
