PennDOT safe driving tips for winter



A properly trained mechanic can check the cooling system, battery, hoses, drive belts, tires and wiper blades to ensure they are in good condition and functioning properly.

Drivers should frequently check all fluid levels, lights and wiper blades throughout the winter and check tire pressure often. PennDOT also advises drivers to carry emergency kits in their vehicles that contain non-perishable food, water, first-aid supplies, warm clothes, a blanket, cell phone charger and a small snow shovel.

When a driver encounters a plow truck, PennDOT recommends they stay at least six car lengths back and make sure the lights of their vehicle are on and should never try to pass or get between several trucks plowing side by side in a "plow train." The weight of the snow thrown from the plow can quickly cause smaller vehicles to lose control. Often plow truck have blind spots, so drivers are asked to never travel next to them.

• Alcohol. Mix one part water to two parts rubbing alcohol, apply to your windows and watch the ice peel right off!

• Dish soap. Use a bottle of 70% isopropyl alcohol with a few drops of dish soap, then apply liberally to the glass with a spray bottle

- 67° Keep thermostat above 55 degrees (day & night)

- Open kitchen cabinets
- Warm up drafty areas with a 60-watt bulb
